JOB DESCRIPTION

Coast Life Support District is a public agency ambulance that covers the communities on the southern Mendocino and northern Sonoma coast, providing 24/7 911 ALS response and transport. Paramedics respond to calls for service and deliver Basic Life Support (BLS) and Advanced Life Support (ALS) patient care, medical assessment, and ambulance transport in accordance with Coastal Valleys EMS policies and procedures. CLSD Paramedics also assist with equipment readiness, and support public education and community risk reduction efforts as assigned.

Minimum 1 year in a high call-volume system as a solo paramedic and at least 3 years as an EMT in a transporting system.
